Arts Commission

Membership: 16

Requirements/Qualifications:

Must be a resident of the City of Stockton
Annual filing of Statement of Economic Interest (FPPC Form 700)

Members shall be selected from among applicants who (outside of professional practice) are active in arts and cultural activities and who demonstrate interest or accomplishments in fund-raising and in one or more of the following art disciplines: Music, Dance, Theater, Cinema, Photography, Architecture, Art Criticism, Textile Arts, Literary Arts, and the Visual Arts; including (but not limited to) the Public or Environmental Arts, Graphic Arts, Design, Drawing, Painting, Printmaking, Sculpture, Ceramics, and Art History.

Function: To encourage, promote and sponsor projects and programs that further the growth and public awareness of the visual, performing and literary arts in Stockton; to offer organizational and promotional assistance to artists and art organizations; and to advise the City Council on the artistic and cultural development of the City.

Building and Housing Board of Appeals

Requirements/Qualifications:

Must be a resident of the City of Stockton at the time of application and continuously thereafter. Failure to reside within the City shall result in automatic forfeiture of appointment. Written notice of change of residence shall be filed with the City Clerk.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Code, the Board whenever there are practical difficulties in carrying out the provisions of the above-mentioned Model Codes or related regulations of the City, may grant modifications for individual cases, provided it shall first find that a special individual reason makes compliance with the strict letter of these codes and regulations impractical and that the modification is in conformity with their intent and purpose.

Function: The Board serves as an advisory body to the City Council and makes recommendations on rules, rates, regulations, and development plans of the Central Parking District

Charter Review Advisory Commission

Requirements/Qualifications:

Resident of the City of Stockton.

After appointment: Ethics Training

FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

(9) Mayor-At-Large, 6 by each of the Council members

Function: Advisory body that reports to the Ad-Hoc Charter Review Committee. The Commission is given by the City Council a specific scope of work, concrete deliverables, and a time schedule for project completion that coincides with certain scheduled upcoming elections.

Term Length/Limit: 2 Years/2 Terms

City Council Salary Setting Commission

Membership: 5

Requirements/Qualifications:

Members must be qualified electors of the City of Stockton and remain qualified electors at all times during the term of office.

Must reside within the urban community of the City of Stockton.

Function: The Salary Setting Commission recommends to the City Council, the amount of monthly salary and the benefits, which it deems appropriate for members of the Council, including the Mayor, for two-year periods.

Function: To adopt, amend or repeal rules for the Civil Service System. To make investigation either upon complaint or upon its own motion concerning any matter touching the administration of the Civil Service System.

To act in an advisory capacity to the City Manager on problems concerning personnel administration.

As provided by rule, to hear appeals of dismissals, demotions or reductions submitted by any person in the competitive service.

Prepare or cause to be prepared a written statement of facts, findings, and recommendations on every appeal. The effect of the Commission's recommendation in case of discharge, demotion or reduction shall be final and binding upon all parties.

Requirements/Qualifications:

None. Desirable to reflect the ethnic balance of the community.

Must be a resident of the City of Stockton

After appointment: FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

Function: Act as advisory body to the City Council;

Studies Housing Department data to determine recommended ongoing project funding levels;

Reviews Department of Housing and Urban Development applications for Community Development funds;

Meets with area residents to analyze activities, needs and community support for newly designated areas.

Term Length/Limit: 4 Years/2 Terms

Cultural Heritage Board

Membership: 9

Requirements/Qualifications:

Must be a resident of the City of Stockton.

Members should be knowledgeable about the historic and cultural traditions of the community, and have a background in preservation, architecture and/or construction technology. A broad-based, balanced representation is sought. Must be a resident of the City of Stockton.

(1) Member having extensive real estate experience, (1) Member having extensive experience in the construction industry; (1) California licensed architect; (1) Historian, (1) City of Stockton resident of over forty (40) years, and, (4) At Large Members

Function: To promote and preserve the community's historical, architectural, aesthetic and cultural resources, identify sites and districts with historical significance, promote the Award of Excellence program, conduct surveys and inspections to accomplish these objectives, advise City officials and other bodies in such areas, and generally encourage and sponsor events of a cultural nature.

Work in a field relevant to the representational categories outlined in Council Resolution 09-0319; Construction/Architect, Engineer, Local Non-profit, Public At-large, Building Industry Assoc., Builders Exchange, General Contractor

Requirements/Qualifications:

Must be a current member of the Civil Service Commission

Members shall not hold any other public office, place or position of employment with the City of Stockton.

Must be a resident and an elector of the City of Stockton.

After appointment: Ethics Training; FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

Function: The Equal Employment Commission is responsible for monitoring the implementation of the Equal Employment Plan and advising the City Council of the City's progress in this area. The Commission will:

Review the Equal Employment Plan, and recommend revisions or additions to the City Council as necessary.

Monitor the City's employment pattern by reviewing personnel-related data.

Hold quarterly Equal Employment Commission meetings and perform other related duties and functions.

Present an annual status report to the City Council on the City's progress regarding implementation of the Equal Employment Plan.

Handicapped Access Board of Appeals

Membership: 5

Requirements/Qualifications:

Must be a resident of the City of Stockton

After appointment: Ethics Training; FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

(2) disabled persons; (2) persons experienced in construction (must also be members of the Building Board of Appeals); and, (1) Lay Person

Function: To hear and decide appeals of administrative decisions including, but not limited to, denials of requests to use alternative methods of providing access to public accommodations by physically disabled persons as required by the California Health and Safety Code, Part 5.5 (Section 19955, 35 seq.).

To approve, disapprove or modify Building Division interpretations of Part 5.5 of Division 13 of the Health and Safety Code (Section 19955 et seq.) including the exceptions contained in Section 19957, and enforce actions taken by the Building Division.

To conduct appeals. The Board's conduct of appeals and decisions shall be governed by the procedures prescribed for the Building Board of Appeals as set forth in Section 15.04.170. (Ord. 026-07 C.S. § 2; prior code § 13-213)

Mayor's Task Force for Persons with Disabilities

Requirements/Qualifications:

Must be a resident of San Joaquin County

Function: To render assistance to other city boards and commissions, to city staff and to private agencies on matters relating to persons with disabilities and would also support the advancement of disability rights at the local, state and national levels.

Term Length/Limit: 1 Year/ N/A

Measure A Citizens' Advisory Committee

Membership: 7

Requirements/Qualifications:

Reside within the City's geographic boundary.

After appointment: FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

To be qualified to serve on the Committee, a person must be at least 18 years of age and not hold an office incompatible with service on the Committee. The Committee may not include any employee or official of the City or any vendor, contractor or consultant of the City.

Function: Perform the duties set forth in the City of Stockton Transaction and Use Tax Ordinance for the Citizens' Advisory Committee, including: At the close of each fiscal year, review the actual expenditures for Measure A to ensure tax proceeds are expended for the purposes set forth in the applicable ballot measure;

Inform the public concerning the City's expenditures of the tax proceeds;

Present an annual written report to the City Council, each year, in a public session to include: compliance, verification that amounts collected were expended for the purposes collected, progress implementing Marshall Plan on Crime and hiring 120 more police officers and other investments, and Committee's proceedings and activities for the preceding year;

Prepare and present a budget recommendation to the City Council, each year, in a public session; and

Review applicability and whether the City has supporting evidence and appropriate findings for the sunset or extension of the sunset of the tax.

Term Length/Limit: 4 Years/2 Terms

Measure W Oversight Committee

Membership: 7

Requirements/Qualifications:

Reside within the City's geographic boundary.

After appointment: FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

To be qualified a person must be at least 28 years of age. The Oversight Committee may not include any employee or office of the City, or any vendor, contractor or consultant doing business with the City.

Function: Along with the annual audit, to assure that monies received from the sales and use tax enacted based on Measure W are being spent in the manner promised to the Stockton Residents. Work steps include the following:
Review copies of revenue and expenditure reports for Measure W; Receive and review information from the City's annual independent audit of Measure W expenditures; Consider oral reports by City staff and other involved persons concerning the use of Measure W monies; Present an annual report to the City Council on whether Measure W monies have been spent correctly.

Term Length/Limit: 2 Years/2 Terms

Parks and Recreation Commission

Membership: 10

Requirements/Qualifications:

Stockton City Council appointees must be residents of the City of Stockton

After appointment: FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

City Council appoints one of its members plus 3 lay members; SJC Board of Supervisors and the Stockton, Lincoln, Lodi and Manteca School Boards shall appoint one for each governing agency; YAC shall appoint one member

Function: Act as the agent of the governing boards of its constituents (City of Stockton, County of San Joaquin, and Unified School Districts representing Stockton, Lincoln, Lodi and Manteca).

Term Length/Limit: 4 Years/2 Terms

Planning Commission

Membership: 7

Requirements/Qualifications:

Must reside in the same district as the appointing Councilmember, with the exception of the Mayor's appointee

After appointment: Ethics Training; FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

Function: To administer the General Plan with the goal of providing a better urban environment for all to enjoy. The General Plan is administered and interpreted in many ways--current and advanced planning projects, zoning and Use Permit hearings, neighborhood analysis and land use studies, and environmental impact reviews. One of the Commission's major functions is the preparation, adoption and interpretation of a comprehensive long-range General Plan which serves as a guide for orderly, responsible development of the City and any land outside its boundaries that affect planning of the City. The Commission serves as an advisory body to the City Council and makes recommendations to the City Council on the General Plan, zoning, code changes, specific plans for streets and highways, redevelopment plans, and conformity of capital improvements with the General Plan.

Term Length/Limit: 4 Years/2 Terms

Port Commission

Membership: 7

Requirements/Qualifications:

Members must be taxpayers within the District.

After appointment: Ethics Training; FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

Members must have resided in the Port District at least one year prior to appointment (Harbors & Navigation Code Section 6244); or consistent with City General Plan boundaries, plus a one-half mile strip on either side of the Stockton Ship Channel from the Port to Disappointment Slough.

(4) City Council and (3) Board of Supervisors

Function: To exercise general supervision over the Port of Stockton by adopting general rules and regulations which, in its judgment, will best promote the interests of the Port as established under State law.

Term Length/Limit: 4 Years/ N/A

Public Art Advisory Committee

Membership: 9

Requirements/Qualifications:

Members must be residents of Stockton for at least 3 years.

After appointment: Ethics Training; FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

Employment as a professional visual artist and critic of contemporary visual art forums. Experience as an activist for the visual environment. Knowledge of and/or skills in public art; regional and national individual artists and their work; understanding of ethnic and gender diversity; and the Stockton Public Art Plan processes (available from the City Manager's Office or the Stockton Arts Commission) and its implications for the City. Evidence of decision making ability; willingness to tolerate/promote change, experimentation, new artistic and design expressions; and community activities significant enough to confirm knowledge of issues and individuals within the community.

Function: The Public Art Advisory Committee is responsible for implementing the City's Public Art Master Plan. The Committee develops the annual plan which determines which public art projects, when approved by Council, will be undertaken in any given year. The Committee also oversees the process by which artists are selected for public art projects and is responsible for educational programs on public art.

Term Length/Limit: 3 Years/2 Terms

San Joaquin County Commission on Aging

Membership: 22

Requirements/Qualifications:

Residents of San Joaquin County interested in aging issues and concerns.

Stockton City Council appointees must be residents of the City of Stockton.

The Stockton City Council appoints one member to this Board.

1 appointment by each City Council in San Joaquin County (7); 1 appointment by each Supervisory District (5); 1 appointment by San Joaquin County Housing Authority; 1 appointment by San Joaquin County Health Care Services; 1 appointment by San Joaquin County Department of Human Services; 1 Social Security Administration Representative; 1 Department of Aging Long-Term Care Systems Representative; 4 At Large; 1 Disabled

Function: Serves as an advisory body on aging matters to both the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors and to the Department of Aging.

Acts as San Joaquin County Long-Term Care Coordinating Council/Audit Day Health Care Planning Council.

Advises San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors on long-term care.

Term Length/Limit: 3 Years/ N/A

San Joaquin County Mosquito And Vector Control District

Membership: 11

Requirements/Qualifications:

Each person appointed by a city council to be a member of the board of trustees shall be a voter and resident of that city (Health and Safety Code 2022 (b)).

One appointment by each of seven (7) City Councils in San Joaquin County and four (4) appointments by the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors

Function: To provide direction and governance to the District concerning the control of vectors, such as mosquitoes and ticks, and vector-borne diseases, such as West Nile virus and Lyme disease. Control services are provided to all lands, both private and public, within San Joaquin County and its political subdivisions.

Term Length/Limit: 24 months/N/A

San Joaquin Regional Transit District Board

Membership: 5

Requirements/Qualifications:

After appointment: Ethics Training

Must be a resident of district and have resided within the district at least one year immediately prior to appointment to the Board. Stockton City Council appointees must be residents of the City of Stockton.

City Council (2) San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors (2) Joint Council/Supervisors (1)

Function: Supervise and regulate every facility owned and operated by the Transit District, including the fixing of rates, rentals, charges and classifications; and the making and enforcement of rules, regulations, contracts, practices, and schedules, for or in connection with any transit facility owned or controlled by the District.

Term Length/Limit: 4 Years/ N/A

Successor Agency Oversight Board

Membership: 7

Requirements/Qualifications:

Each member shall serve at the pleasure of the entity that appointed such member. Oversight Board members shall have personal immunity from suit for their actions taken within the scope of their responsibilities as members of the Oversight Board.

Two members to be appointed by the Mayor; One must represent employees of the former redevelopment agency; Two members to be appointed by the County Board of Supervisors; One must be a member of the public; One member to be appointed by the San Joaquin County Mosquito and Vector Control District, the largest special district, by property tax share, within the jurisdiction of the former redevelopment agency; One member to be appointed by the County Superintendent of Education; One member to be appointed by the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges.

Function: As the Successor Agency, the City of Stockton accepts all records, assets, liabilities and function of the Redevelopment Agency. It makes payments in accordance with Recognized Obligation Payment Schedules; maintains bond reserves; remits unencumbered balances of the Redevelopment Agency to the County Auditor/Controller; and, disposes of assets and properties of the former Redevelopment Agency as directed by the Oversight Board.

Maintains the Administrative support for the Successor Agency, the Oversight Board and all of the ongoing activities; Administrative functions limited to 5% of the total tax allocation received by the Successor Agency for the first year and 3% thereafter.

Oversight Board members shall have fiduciary responsibilities to holders of enforceable obligations, as that term is defined in H&S 34171(d), and the taxing entities that benefit from distributions of property tax and other revenues pursuant to H&S 34188. Direct the Successor Agency on disposal of assets and approve certain Successor Agency actions, for example modification of loan repayment terms, refunding of outstanding bonds, City retention of any former Redevelopment Agency properties.

Requirements/Qualifications:

After appointment: Ethics Training

FPPC Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700)

Members must reside in one of the Stockton Municipal Utilities' three utility service areas. Each member's term coincides with the term of the Council Member or Mayor that nominated the member.

Function: To advise the Council Water Committee on current and future water issues impacting water, wastewater, and storm water utilities for the City of Stockton, including the review of the Department of Municipal Utilities monthly Operations and Maintenance Report.

Term Length/Limit: 4 Years/2 Terms
